Update on Dino Calvert

I have had many opportunities to visit and provide chiropractic care for Dino since his fall and subsequent paralysis.

He suffered a spinal cord injury that left him paralyzed from the neck down. He has been completely unable to move his legs and arms and has no feeling from the shoulders down. He has maintained an excellent spirit throughout this horrible ordeal. I have the feeling that he has discovered a new sense of humour or he is re-enacting one that has been dormant for a while. He laughs heartily at jokes and has a few that keep him laughing.

He had surgery 2 weeks ago and his lower neck was fused down with mechanical screws. He is recovering from that. As far as is known, Dino does not have a severance of the cord. Although no one can predict accurately what his outcome will be, Dino has maintained the goal to at least recover the use of his arms and hands. He says that he can along with a wheel chair as long as he has use of his hands.

I say this about Dino: I am sure that it is difficult for him at times, but he has risen to the occasion and is planning to get back in the game of life. He has been enduring strong physiotherapy and rehabilitation exercises which have produced an increase in arm strength and some movements to his arms.

Overall things look positive for Dino. He still has no feelings and no movement to his legs, but he is responding as well as can be expected in his occupational therapy and rehab sessions. His attitude is good and he is maintaining a positive attitude and can visualize himself in action once more. He accepts with a great dignity what has occurred and is facing this challenge like the good man that he is. You can't keep a good man down!

The Fall Driver's School is Now Open

The Winnipeg Sports Car Club High Performance Driving Experience (HPDE)/Race School is on October 6/7 at the track at Gimli, MB. It is mandatory for anyone wishing to get a Western Canada Motorsports Association (WCMA) annual Race or Solo License. There is a classroom session in Winnipeg from 7 to 9 on the Thursday evening preceding the school weekend at Aalto's in the Canad Inn on Regent (not the casino one but on the south side near Plessis).

The weekend part is on the track at Gimli, so bring a car, a helmet and a driver's license. We provide the instructors. Some people take the school just for the fun of it. If you're one of those register for the HPDE. If you intend to take part in lapping, SoloSprint events, or to race next summer, register for RACE. It's the same school.

Come to the track before 9 on Saturday. That morning you'll be involved in a series of exercises helping you improve your car control skills. There will then be a chance to get oriented to the track with a small tutorial on each corner. Next you will be assigned to a lapping group and an instructor will take you around for a familiarization lap or two in your car. Then you will get a chance to drive the track with your instructor in a small lapping group. A lunch wagon should arrive about then and there'll be time off to eat. Next you will take your turn with your group in running practice laps with an instructor to offer feedback. If you are doing well in a corner they will cheer you on and if your line isn't working so well they will help you figure out how to do it differently.

Once you master the corners there'll be more track time with your lapping groups practicing alternate lines as well as some practice starts and practice passing. There will be no actual racing. When lapping, if a faster car comes up behind you, they will only pass on the straights and you are asked to signal them past. Finally there will be some time at the end of the day for practice laps. Instructors will remain available.

The track is open Sunday for practice lapping and instructors will be available in the morning. You are welcome to join a lapping group in the afternoon when we will be joined by some club members who want some lapping time. Some of the club members who have been instructing may bring their race cars and do a few laps on Sunday afternoon for test and tune purposes. If you ask nicely they may even take you for a ride.

You need to be a club member to enter the school and you can do that through the DLB Racing website when you register for the school. The club membership is \$50 and the school fee is \$200. Your membership will apply to 2012 and 2013. You can pay through PayPal if you have an account. We can't reserve a spot for you at the school if you don't pay. If you don't/can't use PayPal, email me and I'll tell you where to send your check. After you get your membership, DLB will let you register. Make up numbers when they ask for them or use zeros. Registration is now open. You might want to jump in fairly quickly once registration opens as we're only taking 15 and it fills up pretty fast. If you still want to take people for rides you can take them on Friday lapping days or during the hot laps at the end of Saturday.
